

Trip Itinerary: Camino de Santiago, Spain Holiday

April 25 to May 7, 2016

HOLA Day 1

Upon arrival at the Santiago de Compostela airport, we shall transfer to village of

Ambasmestas (approx. 2.5 hours).

O'CEBREIRO TO TRIACASTELA Day 2

The day starts with a steady climb to the Alto do Poio, the highest point of the Camino de Santiago in Galicia. Our destination is Triacastela (a village meaning "three castles"). Although

there are no castles remaining, there is an 18th century church still standing. (Moderate,

21.2km)

TRIACASTELA TO SARRIA Day 3

From Triacastela, the picturesque trail soon starts to climb, as we ascend the Alto de Riocabo.

From here it's a gradual descent into the town of Sarria. (Moderate, 18km)

SARRIA TO PORTOMARIN Day 4

Today's section of the Camino is one of the most picturesque. We walk through rural countryside, traversing enchanted forests and small patches of farmland to the banks of the

Mino River. En route to Portomarin, we'll pass the 100km marker. (Moderate, 21.5km)

TOUR OF LUGO Day 5

Guided by an art historian, we shall visit the UNESCO city of Lugo. This small town is unique

for its perfectly conserved, 50ft high, city wall, which still surrounds the center of Lugo.

PORTOMARIN TO PALAS DE REI Day 6

Today, we'll be passing through small villages decorated with cruceiros, meeting other

peregrinos on the trail. (Moderate, 24km)

PALAS DE REI TO CASTANEDA Day 7

We'll trace the Camino as it weaves along country lanes and ancient stone pathways called

corredoiras. Farmers tend their fields and the chimes of cow bells accompany the sounds of

our footsteps. (Moderate, 23km + 1.5km)

COOKING CLASS Day 8

Our cooking class will be at O Muino de Pena, a tranquil rural restaurant/inn housed within a

restored water mill and located on the banks of the Mera river.

Day 9 Today's section of the Camino weaves through meadows and forests of eucalyptus, passing

through tranquil villages along the way with curious names such as Xen, Ras and Brea. We'll stroll under shady fig trees and fragrant eucalyptus to reach O Pino. (Moderate, 24km +

1.5km)

RUA TO SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA Day 10

CASTANEDA TO RUA

Walk through rolling terrain towards Lavacolla to ascend the Monte del Gozo ("Mount of Joy"), the point where pilgrims first catch sight of the spires of the Cathedral of Santiago. And finally, we arrive in Obradoiro square, in front of the immense Cathedral; it is an exciting moment.

(Moderate, 19km)

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GUIDED TOUR OF SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA Day 11

TOUR OF COSTA DA MORTE Day 12

This full day guided excursion will have us exploring the spectacular Costa da Morte (the ominous sounding "Death Coast"), home to rugged cliffs, beautiful sandy beaches and tranquil fishing towns. We shall stop in Finisterre - the final destination for many pilgrims or "the end of the earth".
